



have your party




once it's safe for people to get together again," Mom said.

Adriana followed her family out the front door.



obstacle course (n.)	a race or course in which people or other animals crawl under, climb over, and in other ways get around objects placed in their way (p. 3)
social distancing (n.)	the act of staying away from other people in order to keep a sickness from spreading (p. 6)
spread (n.)	the growth of something so it affects more people or covers a larger area (p. 6)
